Chapter 2- Syllabus & Classroom Policies and Procedures

Edison High School Choir Syllabus

Edison Choir Course Objectives

Intermediate Mixed Chorus (I...) and Intermediate Women's Chorus (Incandescence)

These choruses are open to experienced choristers who would like to further develop their skills, as well as those with little experience. In this course, students will not only sing a lot, but they will also increase their personal level of musical literacy, understanding of the elements of music, musical expression, ensemble awareness, and performance skills. There will also be emphasis on the historical and cultural backgrounds and significance of the music we sing. This class prepares students for upper level choruses, and can be repeated. For ladies, admission to I... is by audition only.

Advanced Mixed Chorus (Innovation) and Advanced Women's Chorus (Ingenuity)

Admission to these choirs is by audition only. Students in these ensembles will perform challenging music from a wide variety of musical periods and styles. In addition, students will increase their personal level of musical literacy, understanding of the elements of music, musical expression, ensemble awareness, and performance skills. Students will become familiar with the historical and cultural backgrounds and significance of the choir's selected repertoire.

Required Materials

Pencil – *Bring one and leave it in your folder.*

Water Bottle – *If you plan to drink water during rehearsal, bring a water bottle. If you forget one, you may purchase water for \$1.*

Folder and Music – *These are provided. You may leave this on your assigned shelf in the choir room. If you choose to bring your folder home, you must remember to bring it with you to every class. If you lose your folder and/or music, you will be charged a replacement fee. Music is approximately \$2 per copy.*

Classroom Expectations

Be: Prompt, Prepared, and Polite

Don't Be: Distracted or Distracting

Not Allowed: Food or drink (except water), gum, candy, cell phones, electronic devices

Consequences

Students who do not follow the classroom expectations as outlined above will receive the appropriate consequence listed below to help them correct their behavior.

- 1st offense or mildly disruptive behavior
Student will correct behavior immediately.
- 2nd offense OR more disruptive behavior
Student will write his or her name in the refocus book and wait in the refocus area for the teacher's invitation to rejoin the rehearsal.
- 3rd offense OR very inappropriate behavior
Student will complete a Behavior Reflection Form and hand it to the teacher at the end of class. Student may be required to get a guardian's signature on the form (due the next class period).
- Extreme behavior OR many offenses
Student will be sent to the office and a referral will be written. The rest of the consequence will be determined by an administrator and will be dependent on the offense.

Attendance

All teachers follow Fairfax County Public Schools regulations for attendance. Please refer to Student Rights and Responsibilities Regulation 2601.25P on page 10. Students are subject to discipline consequences for tardies, class cuts, and all day unexcused absences.

Academic Integrity

There will be absolutely no tolerance for cheating in any form. Cheating is giving or receiving unauthorized aid on any assignment. It is important that students do their own work to maximize their learning. Portable communication devices found in use during any testing environment will result in confiscation. Students with issues of plagiarism, use of electronic devices during an assessment and other forms of cheating will be referred to their administrator and teacher will contact parents/guardians.

Concert Attire

In order to perform in our concerts, students must be in proper concert attire. At some concerts we will wear our casual uniforms, while at others we will wear our formal attire, as outlined below.

Casual uniforms

- ❖ Chorus Polo shirt (included in class fee)

Formal uniforms

- ❖ Men's uniform
 - Tuxedo pants, jacket, shirt, bow-tie, and vest
 - Black socks and dress shoes
- ❖ Women's uniform
 - Formal dress
 - Black closed-toe shoes (heels and flats are both acceptable. Heels must be 2" or less in height)

Other uniform considerations

- ❖ Hair should be styled away from your face.
- ❖ Do not draw attention to yourself and away from the choir by your appearance.

Chapter 3- Financial Information

Class Materials and Uniform Fees

Consistent with Regulation 5922, the chorus class fee will not exceed \$200 per student in any given school year. The fee covers formal uniforms (which must only be purchased one time), as well as the casual uniform (a polo shirt), and class supplies. Your individual fee amount can be determined by filling out the "Choir Fees Form", and then paid for through fundraising and/or with cash or check made payable to Edison High School.

Spring Trip

The choirs take a smaller trip every other year, and the 2016-2017 school year is scheduled for a smaller trip to Lancaster, PA (Ms. R's HS alma mater!) Details about the trip will be announced at the beginning of the second quarter. The cost for this year's trip will be between \$250-\$300, and we are working with the Choral Guild to provide a major contribution through fundraising for ALL students to attend this trip! Money earned this year must be used during the 2016-2017 school year. This fee is determined and assessed based on the estimated cost of the trip/activity – including such costs as transportation, accommodation, registration, food, and other miscellaneous expenses. Our spring trip is an FCPS-sponsored optional activity for those students who choose to participate.

District Choir, All-State Choir, Solo & Ensemble Payments

There are opportunities throughout the school year for individual students to choose to audition and/or participate in other music activities. Examples include the All-District or All-State Music and the Solo and Ensemble Festival. Audition or participation fees are often assessed for these opportunities by the sponsoring organization. Such fees are not established by the Edison Choral Department, but the Edison Choral Department often assists in the collection of these fees from individuals who elect to participate and the submission of one group payment to the respective sponsoring organization. These fees are communicated at the time other information about these opportunities is communicated.

Payment Policies

Payments may be made cash or check as described below.

- ❖ Payments made by check should be given to Ms. Robinson. If paying by check, please make the check payable as instructed for the particular payment and write the name of the student and the name of the fee being paid in the memo line of the check. Please note that a fee not to exceed \$50 will be assessed for any returned checks.

 - ❖ If paying by cash, please put the money in an envelope and write the name of the student and the name of the fee being paid (i.e. Tom Smith, spring trip fee). The payment should be given to the Fine Arts teacher or to the Edison High School staff responsible for collecting such cash payments at the front office. A receipt will be provided to you acknowledging the cash payment.
- *No cash should be deposited into the lockboxes within the music room.**

Refunds

Typically fees paid are non-refundable once commitments and purchases have been made. These refund policies will be communicated separately as they relate to individual activities.

Financial Assistance

Financial assistance is available for those in need of such assistance. Requests for financial assistance should be made directly to the Fine Arts teacher prior to the due date for the related fee.

Mixed Chorus- I... Chorus (928515) Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12 Credit: one Prerequisite: none Students will participate in a chorus of mixed voices. Emphasis is placed upon correct vocal performance techniques and sight-singing through the study of appropriate choral literature. Based on successful completion of sequential concepts for each level, students will continue as specified in course level. Students must meet both the school day and outside of the school day participation requirements to receive credit for the course. This course requires a student materials fee as listed in FCPS Notice 5922.

Advanced Mixed Chorus- Innovation (928915) Level 1 Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12 Credit: one Prerequisite: Successful audition. Students are offered advanced choral experiences for mixed voices. Emphasis is placed on the development of musicianship and proficiency in ensemble performance. Course content includes a study of choral literature, vocal techniques, and sight-singing. Based on successful completion of sequential concepts for each level, students will continue as specified in course level. Students must meet both the school day and outside of the school day participation requirements to receive credit for the course. This course requires a student materials fee as listed in FCPS Notice 5922.

Women's Chorus- Ingenuity & Incandescence (928916 & 926016) Grades: 9, 10, 11, 12 Credit: one Prerequisite: none Students will participate in a chorus of women's voices. Emphasis is placed upon correct vocal performance techniques and sight-singing through the study of appropriate choral literature. Based on successful completion of sequential concepts for each level, students will continue as specified in course level. Students must meet both the school day and outside of the school day participation requirements to receive credit for the course. This course requires a student materials fee as listed in FCPS Notice 5922

Chapter 5- Grading Procedures

Grading Procedures

Graded assignments will include written work as well as performances, presentations, and occasional rehearsals and performances that take place outside of class. Please familiarize yourself with the calendar so that you will not miss any of these mandatory events.

Grades for missed chorus events can be partially made-up if unexcused; missing events without a pre-arranged excuse will result in a maximum grade of 80%. If you need to be excused from a chorus event, you must submit a Chorus Event Excuse Form at least 2 weeks before the event in order to be given the opportunity to make-up 100% of the grade. Failure to notify me at least 2 weeks ahead of time will result in an unexcused absence, and a maximum grade of 80%.

*Please be advised that I do not grant excused absences from chorus events liberally, and work is RARELY an accepted excuse - you will always have plenty of time to notify your employer of the dates you need off. I understand emergencies (car accidents, illnesses, deaths in the family, etc.) happen - if such a situation arises, be sure to talk to me as soon as possible, rather than taking an automatic "F" for the concert.

All final grades will be calculated in both numerical percentages and quality points.

Mastery Learning Policy

In order to enable all students to demonstrate mastery of the concepts and skills to be learned and demonstrated in this course, the following policies regarding late work, retakes, and make-up quizzes has been established:

Late Work

Late work is accepted anytime between its original due date and one week prior to term grades. However, you may not take a test until you have completed each assignment for that unit, and you must take each test within one week of the day it was given in class. A maximum of 20% will be deducted for late assignments.

Retakes and Make-up Work

Retake and “Make-Up” quizzes will be administered for 2 weeks following the original quiz date. In the case of retakes, students will receive their higher score. It is up to the student to schedule their retake or “make-up” quiz with the teacher.

EHS Honor Code

All students will adhere to the EHS Honor Code policy as listed on the EHS school website.

Semester Concert Attendance

A vital part to any growth of an ensemble and cultivating a collaborative music department is watching other groups perform. Each semester a student is required to attend a concert and do a write-up on the concert. The concert music must be classical in nature and must feature singers (Concert choir, chamber ensemble, voice recital). The performance must be at least their performance level (ie: other high school choirs, youth choirs, professional choirs, ect...) They may not be middle or elementary school concerts or performance on the Internet. Students must provide a program from the concert or a ticket stub as proof that they attended the concert. Please note that the due date for the paper is due no later than TWO weeks after the performance takes place. It is vital to do the write-up while the concert is still fresh in the student’s mind. If a student is unable to attend a concert during each semester, Ms. Robinson will provide a day where students can come in and watch a concert after school. This semester concert review will be due either at the end of 2nd quarter (First Semester) or the day of their Final (Second Semester). This year, the students will be expected to go see a performance by another discipline within the music department (band, orchestra or piano) during first or second quarter. More information will be presented after the start of school.

Standards of Learning

All students will participate in District X Performance Assessment in March. This is the equivalent of SOL testing for ensemble courses. <http://www.fcps.edu/is/finearts/music.shtml>

Final Exam

All students will have a graded assessment during the designated final exam period. The final exam represents 12% of a student’s final grade. Final exams will not be administered to students prior to the scheduled exam and time except as noted below:

Permission to Take a Final Exam Early

Teacher must receive requests for missing a scheduled final exam at least one week prior to the exam. The request must be in the form of a letter from the parent, and must include the reason to warrant a deferral. If approved, the student will take his or her final exam at the teacher’s discretion. The content administrator should be notified in the event of an early exam. If teachers deem it necessary, then arrangements can be made with their students to take their exam with an administrator after school had dismissed for the summer.

Google Classroom will also direct you to the EHS Chorus Website, www.ehschorus.com, where more detailed announcements, calendars, recordings, forms, and policies can be found. SIS now has a ParentVue component. Parents can access their student's attendance and grade progress at any time. With the exception of some major assignments and projects, grades will be posted in SIS within 7 (school) days of their due date.


